THE ART O'NEILL WALK

By tradition the Art O'Neill Walk takes place every year on the first Friday night/Saturday morning in January. Of all the long distance walks in the Irish Hillwalking calendar this must rank as one of the toughest.

The walk starts at midnight, from the gates of Dublin Castle and continues for 35 miles as far as Glenmalure in the heart of Wicklow. The first 20 miles approx., of the walk is by road as far as Ballynultagh Gap and the remainder of the walk is through the mountains, via Billy Byrne's Gap and Ballinagee Bridge to Glenmalure.

The walking time is approximately 14 to 15 hours. The walk commemorates the escape route from Dublin Castle taken by Art O'Neill and Red Hugh O'Donnell in 1592.

They had been lured on boars a ship in Lough Swilly 6 years previously, kidnapped and imprisoned in Dublin Castle as Hostages. As long as they were held captive there was no fear of the O'Neill or O'Donnell Clans rebelling against the Crown.

They escaped for the second time on the 6th January 1592, having been recaptured on the first occasion. They reached the Glenreemore Valley, only a few miles from Fiach Mac Hugh O'Byene's camp in Glenmalure, but could go no further. They were exhausted and frozen, wearing only light clothes and blankets. They took shelter under an overhinging cliff while their guide went on to get help. When help finally did arrive both men were covered in snow, and hailstones had stuck their hair to the ground. Art was found to be dead and was buried at the spot. Red Hugh survived but lost some toes from frostbite.

Today a plaque commemorates the spot in the Glenreemore Valley where Art died and was buried. Red Hugh O'Donnell who survived went on to lead a rebellion against the Crown with his ally Red Hugh O'Neill, culminating in defeat at the Battle of Kinsale in 1601, and the Treaty of Melifont in 1603.

This January 37 walkers, consisting of members of The Ramblers, The Wayfarers and An Oige Hillwalkers Club took part in the walk. By 2am, we had reached the Stone Cross at Bohernabreena and by 6am, we had reached Ballynultagh Gap. It was a clear frosty night and it was a wonderful sight to see the line of torches moving through the snow covered landscape.

By 9am, we were at Ballinagee Bridge and the rain was pouring down. A much appreciated breakfast was very kidly seved to us by volunteers from the Ramblers Club and was appreciated by the walkers. The group then proceeded into the Glenmalure Valley and soon Art O'Neill's grave came into sight. Here bagan the hardest part of the walk with a very steep climb out of the valley towards Art's Cross. With the rain

and sleet still pouring down the group finally reached the Glenmalure Hostel, between 1.30pm and 2.00pm., where wonderful stew was served to us by volunteers from An Oige.

Out of the 37 people that started the walk, 32 managed to complete it. Two walkers dropped out at Ballysmutton Bridge, where they were able to get a lift back to town by a driver who kindly did back-up until this point. A further three walkers dropped out at Ballinagee Bridge.

Anyone hoping to do this walk in the future would be advised as part of their training to have completed a few 20 mile road walks prior to the official walk. Runners or strong shoes would be suitable footwear for the road walk and hiking boots for the section through the mountains.

One should also have a torch, with spare batteries and bulb, a complete change of clothes, a hot drink, adequate food for the time you will be out, and a first-aid kit with them on this tough walk.

Personally I found it to be a great endurance test, and a remarkable achievement to have completed the walk. I hope that it continues to be organised for many years to come, not only because of its challenge, but also for its historical lonk with the past. Congratulations to the members of my own club — The An Oige Hillwalkers Club, who both took part and completed the walk.
