


Booking is now open through An Óige Head Office. The cost of the weekend is £60.00 to include train, bus and three overnights but not including meals. Two evening meals £14.00 extra if required. A non-refundable deposit of £30.00 is

Accommodation: Glanmore Lake Hostel, Beara Peninsula. Capacity is limited to thirty people. The services of the bus will NOT be available over the weekend. There are no restaurants/shops/pubs nearby, so people should bring ALL food with them for the entire weekend. The hostel can provide a standard evening meal @ £7.00

per head on the Saturday and Sunday evenings. This facility is strictly limited to twenty people. Please indicate your preference on booking. The hostel has the

usual self-catering facilities.

Transport:

THE COMERAGH BOG TROT

18h April

Organising Club:

Peaks Mountaineering Club, Clonmel.

Map No:

Discovery Sheet No 75

Fee:

£5.00 (payable on the day)

Opening checkpoint:

The walk starts near Kilrossanty and finishes at Powers the Pot

Hostel.

Checkpoint opening time: 7.30AM. approx.

Checkpoint list:

Start - Far Breaga - Seefin - Knockaunapeebra - Cairn - The Gap

Knockanaffrin North - Finish Powers the Pot.

Distance:

14 miles approx.

Height gain:

5,000ft approx.

Average time: 7 hours in good weather and without breaks.

Participants can park at Powers the Pot Hostel and a bus will take them around to the start of the walk. The first bus will leave the hostel at 7.00AM. or when the bus is full.

PLEASE NOTE These walks are NOT led hikes. Participants need to know how to navigate and have a high level of fitness. You are responsible for yourself during these walks.

LOCAL HISTORY

Glenasmole or the Valley of the Thrushes

Glenasmole or the upper valley of the Dodder is surrounded by the slopes of Mount Pellier on the east, and Seahan, Corrig and Seefingan on the west. Kippure forms the southern boundary of the valley.

Bohernabreena's terrain is mountainous, consisting of both acidic and alkaline soil. A carpet of heather on the higher ground gives way to bracken forest, river valley and finally to the patchwork effect of small fields bordered by stone walls. Because of the diversity of terrain and soil we enjoy a fascinating abundance of flora and fauna.

The valley has long been associated with the legendary Finn MacCool. In one old Irish poem - "The Chase of Glenasmole" it is related how Finn with his famous hounds, Brann and Sgeolan, and a number of hunters and dogs met one misty morning in the glen to hunt deer. They chased a piebald doe, but although they hunted her all day were unable to overtake her, and when darkness set in, they found themselves far away among the wild hills without any of their hounds, which had all become lost in the excitement of the chase. After a time however, Brann returned in a sorry state, Not long after a beautiful woman appeared on the scene and invited the whole party to a feast which they gladly accepted. When they had satisfied themselves at the feast a hideous witch from Greece appeared and asked Finn to be her husband. She was so enraged at his refusal that she threatened to kill them all. She set off with her fleet to Howth, where she landed and fought with Goll MacMorna the Brave for three days, while fifty amazons kept guard over the enchanted Fianna. Just as the witch was about to overcome Goll, the Fianna broke the enchantment, and rushing to battle, Oscar drove his spear through her heart, and the slaughter of her amazon bodyguard followed.

In another poem called "The Finnian Hunt of Sliabh Truim", it is related how Finn, after a victorious campaign through the country, slaying dragons, serpents, and all kinds of monsters, attacks and kills the terrible Arrach or dragon of Glenasmole. These poems probably date from the 12th century.

The dams at the Bohernabreena's waterworks were built around 1882, by a Scottish team of contractors, Messrs Stanford and Faulkner, for the Rathmines Commission. One was intended to supply to the township and the adjacent areas, while the other was for local use, serving the various mills in Tallaght, Firhouse, etc. The dams were constructed from stone obtained from Corrig Mountain. The waterworks were taken over by Dublin Corporation in 1931 and supplies approximately 4,000,000 gallons of water to the city each day.

MOUNTAIN RESCUE NEWS

The Dublin/Wicklow Mountain Rescue team is one of the most active in the country. It has dealt with almost 50 call-outs in 1997 The service is an Emergence 999/112 service and is not funded by the Government, save for some grant aid from the Dept. of Environment to help insurance and some training costs.

This spring they are embarking on fund raising drive with a principal focus on replacing one of their ageing mobile operations and equipment emergence vehicles and secondary to that they intend to upgrade their medical equipment set-up.

They are seeking committed people to help raise £20,000. They are looking for people to organise some small fund raising event to raise £250. Every person who raises this minimum will be entitled to take part in their Great Mountain Challenge (see long walks programme on page 5). Further information is available from
