


CLUB TRAVEL

THE GREAT WILDERNESS BACKPACK

Members may be interested in a backpacking trip to Scotland which I did earlier in the Summer. It was to an area known as "The Great Wilderness" or The Letterewe Wilderness in Wester Ross, north of Lock Maree & Kinlochewe, and involved five nights wild camping.

I left Dublin Friday evening on the Bus Eireann/Eurolines overnight service to Leeds, dropping off at Manchester Airport early Saturday morning. Virgin Trains had me in Edinburgh by 10.30am. and Scotrail landed me in Inverness during the afternoon. I continued by Westerbus service to Gruinard Bay on the west coast of Scotland and got off the bus at 7.00pm., exactly twenty-four hours after leaving my home. A two hour walk-in to Loch na Sealga (right below An Teallach) followed, and I soon found a nice spot to pitch my tent for two nights. Sleep came easily, despite a damned noisy cuckoo in the area.

Sunday was spent climbing two Corbetts nearby, Beinn Dearg Mór and Beag, along the southern side of the loch. With a light pack and good conditions a very pleasant day was enjoyed, the views being excellent.

On Monday I trekked the length of the loch to it's eastern end, a rough enough trip, and I then turned up Gleann na Muice. A couple of kilometres up the gleann I came upon a wonderful pitch, a lovely firm green sward of short grass - the sort of camping site all wild-campers dream about - right alongside a small river babbling over the rocks, and mountains towering up on both sides. A quick decision was made and this was to be my "address" for the next two nights. As it was still early in the afternoon I decided to climb the nearest mountain, one of the group known as "The Fisherfield Six". Thus I used up what remained of the afternoon and saved myself about one and a half hours the next day, when I did the remaining five. These six Munros in the Great Wilderness area are very remote and are difficult to complete all at once except by taking up home in the area in either a tent or bothy.

After two extremely pleasant nights camping I really had to drag myself away but time marches on, and so must I. So, on Wednesday I commenced the long walk-out and headed up Gleann na Muice Beag to Carnmore, over the causeway and up into the pass known as the Bealach Mheinnidh. I dropped down the other side a short distance and pitched for the night, overlooking Loch Maree. Kinlochewe, at the eastern end of the loch was my objective the following day and marked the end of my backpacking adventure.

After an 8.30am. start on Thursday, and several hours of trudging along the track above Loch Maree in very hot conditions I arrived in Kinlochewe at 1.30pm. and was able to say "mission accomplished" to myself. I had done everything I set out to do and felt a deep sense of satisfaction.

The entire trip was done solo, as is my normal practice, and public transport was used throughout. Weather was very good and all walking was done in shorts - watch out for the ticks. On Saturday afternoon I returned from Edinburgh to Manchester Airport and then overnight to Dublin via Eurolines.
